### Police Press Log

4/29/2012 to 5/5/2012

Sunday 4/29/2012

0019 hours – Officers Hughes, Blais and Sgt. Eddy responded to Whipple Road for a report of a Domestic Assault. Verbal argument only. One subject transported to the station for a ride, peace restored and report taken.

0142 hours – Officer Blais and Sgt. Eddy responded to Round Top Road for a report of a juvenile runaway. Subject was located in Pascoag at 0231 hours and returned to her residence.

0318 hours – Officer Hughes and Sgt. Eddy responded to Broncos Highway for a reported Motor Vehicle Crash with injuries. Crash was determined to be in Glocester and Glocester PD advised.

1138 hours – Officer Beauchemin responded to Pascoag Main Street for a report of a minor Motor Vehicle Crash in a parking lot.

1227 hours – Officer Kelley and Sgt. Carlow responded to Broncos Highway at the Burrillville Middle School for a report of a 2 car Motor Vehicle Crash with no injuries. One vehicle towed from the scene and a report taken.

1633 hours – Sgt. Carlow called out with a DMV on East Avenue. Female passenger advised the operator had gone to get gas. Sgt. Carlow advised that the operator had a warrant, but he could not locate him. Since the plates did not match the vehicle, the vehicle was towed from the scene and the plates seized.

1929 hours – Sgt. Carlow, Officers Harrison and Blais and all Burrillville Fire Companies responded to Tannerhill Group Home on Laurel Hill Avenue for a reported Structure Fire. First Pascoag unit on scene reported a working fire. Fire was declared under control at 1954 hours and requested the State Fire Marshal. Report taken.

Monday 4/30/2012

1731 hours – Officer Blais responded to Knibb Road for a found wallet. Report taken and attempted to contact owner.

Tuesday 5/1/2012

0043 hours – While on patrol on Broncos Highway Officer Hughes observed a vehicle with a headlight out. He reversed direction and as he followed the vehicle he observed it being operated erratically. He initiated a traffic stop and after a Field Sobriety test arrested the operator on Suspicion of DUI. At the station Brian Gauthier of Burrillville was charged with DUI 1<sup>st</sup> offense after blowing into the Breathalyzer and registering .137% and .138%. Mr. Gauthier was also cited for operating an unregistered motor vehicle, operating without evidence of insurance and laned roadway violations. He was also issued a warning for headlamps required.

1718 hours – AACO Courtemanche entered an offense report for a dog bite on Inman Road. Dog was quarantined and animal control citation issued for failure to restrain and harboring an unlicensed dog.

2142 hours – Sgt. Lacey responded to Railroad Avenue for a report of Vandalism. Report taken.

Wednesday 5/2/2012

0937 hours – While on patrol on Broncos Highway Sgt. Pitts observed a vehicle with an expired registration sticker. He initiated a traffic stop and verified the registration was expired. Vehicle was towed from the scene, plates seized and the operator cited for operating an unregistered vehicle.

1412 hours – Sgt. Pitts and Officer Ducharme responded to the Burrillville High School parking lot for a report of a minor two car Motor Vehicle Crash. Report taken and both vehicles driven from scene under their own power.

2045 hours – Sgt. Lacey and Lt. Connors responded to Douglas Pike for a report of a Disturbance. Officers report argument between parties. Peace restored and report taken.

Thursday 5/3/2012

1725 hours – While on patrol on Chapel Street Officer Blais observed a vehicle with a loud exhaust. He initiated a traffic stop and determined that the operator was wanted on a bench warrant from 6<sup>th</sup> Distract Court. Robert Gores of Burrillville was arrested and charged on the warrant.

Friday 5/4/2012

0814 hours – While on patrol on Broncos Highway Lt. Leahey observed a vehicle fail to stop for a red light at Broncos Highway and East Avenue. He initiated a traffic stop and determined that the vehicle's registration had expired in July of 2011. The vehicle was towed from the scene, the plates seized and the operator cited for obedience to traffic control devices and driving an unregistered vehicle.

1147 hours – Lt. Leahey requested a report number for Information on a Domestic Situation. Report taken.

1341 hours – Officer Ducharme responded to Hillside Drive for a Runaway juvenile. Report taken and subject entered into NCIC as Missing Runaway.

1520 hours – Officer Ducharme responded to the station for a Report of a Lost Plate. Report taken and plate entered into RILETS.

1648 hours – While on patrol on Broncos Highway Officer Kelley observed a vehicle with an expired registration sticker. She initiated a traffic stop and verified that the vehicle registration was expired. The vehicle was towed from the scene, the plates seized and the operator cited for operating an unregistered motor vehicle.

1935 hours - While on patrol on Chapel Street Officer Kelley observed a vehicle with an expired registration sticker. She initiated a traffic stop and verified that the vehicle registration was expired. The vehicle was towed from the scene, the plates seized and the operator cited for operating an unregistered motor vehicle and a notice and demand given for expired inspection sticker.

2147 hours – Officer Kelley and Sgt. Eddy responded to Church Street for a reported Assault. All parties questioned and report taken.

2238 hours – Officer Kelley and Sgt. Eddy responded back to Church Street to follow up on the Assault complaint. While investigating a witness they determined that he had a bench warrant. Christopher Beauregard of Burrillville was arrested on the warrant.

Saturday 5/5/2012

0141 hours – Sgt. Eddy and Officer Blais responded to Broncos Highway for a report of a vehicle off the road. Vehicle was gone on arrival, however they determined that a utility pole had been struck and witnesses gave them a description of the vehicle.

0201 hours – Officer Genereux on a traffic post on Harrisville Main Street observed a vehicle matching the description from the earlier accident and initiated a traffic stop. After conducting a field sobriety test. Tyler Paquette of Burrillville was arrested and charged with DUI 1<sup>st</sup> offense, Driving in Possession of Controlled Substances and Possession of Marijuana 1<sup>st</sup> offense.

0256 hours – Sgt. Eddy, Officers Genereux and Blais responded to North Hill Road for a report of a truck into a fence. The vehicle was gone on arrival however was spotted by Sgt. Eddy on Steere Farm Road at the town line. He stopped the vehicle, however the vehicle sped off at a high rate of speed and driving erratically on South Main Street to Putnam Pike. Vehicle turned onto Jackson Schoolhouse Road, failed to negotiate a curve and struck a bridge railing. The suspect jumped out of his vehicle and ran away with Sgt. Eddy and Officer Genereux in pursuit. The suspect then jumped into the water and swam away. Minutes later a neighbor on Lake Drive in Gloucester called Gloucester Police that there was a male in her backyard. Units responded however were unable to locate the subject at that time. Later in the day Jefferey Joergensen of Gloucester was arrested and charged with Vandalism, False Report of a Crime, Obstruction of an Officer in the Execution of Duty, as well as cited for multiple motor vehicle charges.

1345 hours - Lt. Leahey and Officer Richardson responded to Old Wallum Lake Road for a report of a Domestic Disturbance. Report taken.

1501 hours – Officer Beauchemin and Lt. Leahey responded to Carol Drive for a report of an Unwanted Subject. Following an investigation Eva M. Ligeri of Rehobeth, MA was arrested and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

1550 hours – Officer Harrison responded to Hillside Drive to verify that the Runaway juvenile had returned home Subject was removed from NCIC.
