The Ocean State Power Burrillville Community Foundation, established in 1988, and fully implemented in 1990, is a private non-profit corporation funded with thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) annually by TransCanada's Ocean State Power Facility for the sole purpose of supporting and contributing to civic projects within the Town of Burrillville, Rhode Island.
