2009 Charter Review

The Burrillville Town Charter was originally adopted in 1988 "to secure the right of self government in all local matters, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations". From time to time, the Charter is reviewed by a commission of residents appointed by the Burrillville Town Council. The Town Council is currently seeking applicants to serve on the Charter Review Commission. It will be the responsibility of the commission to review the Charter and submit to the Town Council a report with its recommendations for amendments, additions or deletions.

I encourage Burrillville residents who are interested in the nature of local government to apply. Applications for a position on the Charter Review Commission are available at the Town Building, 105 Harrisville Main St., Harrisville, or on-line at the Town website, www.burrillville.org.
