Legal Beagle

When the Town of Burrillville's laws were codified, the Town Council recognized numerous purposes for establishing zoning ordinances. Those purposes included, but were not limited to: (1) promoting public health, safety and welfare, (2) providing for a range of uses appropriate to the character of the town, while reflecting current and expected future needs, (3) providing for orderly growth and development, (4) providing for the control, protection and abatement of air, water and noise pollution and (5) promoting implementation of the town's comprehensive plan. Toward this end, the town is divided into ten zoning districts and four overlay districts, which are all identified in Section 30-31 (a). We are generally familiar with farming and residential districts, but see if you can name them all without looking first. Each of the districts has a unique and particular intention and purpose. Our town's building official, Joe Raymond, is designated as the zoning enforcement officer, who is empowered to enforce the provisions of the zoning ordinances. A Zoning Board of Review is empowered to hear and decide appeals from any aggrieved party or for applications for variances or special use permits. Appeals from the Zoning Board are taken to Superior Court.
