Police Press Log

5/13/2012 to 5/19/2012

Sunday 5/13/2012

0131 hours – Sgt. Carlow, advised he was out with a possible Domestic Disturbance in a parking lot on South Main Street. Male subject ran off into the woods. An arrest warrant was issued for Glenn Latendresse of Burrillville and he was charged with Domestic Simple Assault, Domestic Vandalism and Domestic Failure to Relinquish Phone.

0441 hours – Attendant at Sunoco Gas Station on Chapel Street reported he was just robbed at gunpoint. Suspect described as a white male wearing a red “hoodie” and black and white plaid pants or shorts. Area search for suspect was negative. Case under investigation.

1043 hours – Sgts. Lacey and Pitts along with EMS responded to Shea Lane for a report of a child out of control. Subject transported to Hasbro Children’s Hospital and report taken.

1147 hours – Sgt. Lacey responded to the Bike Path for a report of someone yelling for help. He made contact with a father and his sons and the father stated he was yelling at them to slow down because they were getting too far ahead of him.

1645 hours – Officer Harrison and Sgt. Lacey responded to Melissa Lane for a report of a canoe filled with water out on the Pascoag Reservoir with personal items including a cell phone. They traced the owner through the cell phone and determined that he had already reported the accident to DEM. DEM handled.

2116 hours – Sgt. Lacey and Officer Kelley responded to Victory Highway for a Domestic Disturbance. Investigation revealed a verbal argument. One party left for the evening, peace was restored and a report taken.

Monday 5/14/2012

1703 hours – Officer Kelley followed up on a traffic stop on Whipple Avenue and determined that the vehicle was unregistered. Operator cited for operating an unregistered vehicle and the plates seized.

Tuesday 5/15/2012

0635 hours – Officers Genereux and Beauchemin responded to Broncos Highway for a Motor Vehicle Crash, car vs deer. Deer expired on roadway, DEM advised and report taken.

0659 hours – Sgt. Eddy, Officers Genereux and Beauchemin responded to High Street for a report of a runaway. Subject was located on Rock Avenue and returned home.

0738 hours – Officer Beauchemin responded to Chapel Street for a Motor Vehicle Crash, car vs hydrant. Vehicle driven from the scene, Harrisville Water Department advised and report taken.

0739 hours – Glen Latendresse of Burrillville turned himself into the station on a warrant. He was arrested and charged with Domestic Simple Assault, Domestic Vandalism and Domestic Failure to Relinquish Phone.

1503 hours – Officer Blais, Detective Cahill, Sgt. Lacey and Major Guglietta responded to Harrisville Main Street for a report of a Fight in Progress. As a result of their investigation Thomas R. Dramby of Burrillville was arrested and charged with Disorderly Conduct and Vandalism, Mathew D. Deslauriers was arrested and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

1505 hours – Assistant Animal Control Officer Courtemanche filed a report from an earlier incident on Iron Mine Road where a subject was assaulted and bitten by a dog. The Doberman was secured and quarantined and the miniature Pinscher was also secured and impounded. The owner was cited for Dog Bite at Large and a vicious dog hearing will be held as this is the dog's second bite.

1724 hours – Several 911 calls were received for a Motor Vehicle Crash, roll over on Broncos Highway. Officer Blais, Sgt. Lacey, Lt. Leahey and Major Guglietta responded along with Fire and EMS units. First units on scene reported wires down. National Grid was advised. One subject was transported to Landmark Medical Center, the vehicle was towed from the scene and a report taken.

1728 hours – While enroute to the above call Officer Blais reported another Motor Vehicle Crash at Broncos Highway and East Avenue. Officer Kelley responded. Both vehicles driven from the scene and a report taken.

1806 hours – Walk in to the police station reported a Motor Vehicle Crash with Injuries, Broncos Highway at East Avenue. Officers Blais, Kelley, Sgt. Lacey and Fire and EMS units responded. One subject was transported to RI Hospital, both vehicles were towed from the scene and a report taken.

Wednesday 5/16/2012

1152 hours – Officer Beauchemin responded to the station for a walk in complaint about Threats. Report taken.

1350 hours – Sgt. Pitts responded to Whipple Road for a complaint of Larceny. Report taken.

Thursday 5/17/2012

Saturday 5/19/2012

0202 hours – While on patrol on Broncos Highway Officer Hughes observed a vehicle being operated erratically. He initiated a traffic stop on Victory Highway and performed Field Sobriety Tests. Based on his observations, Brandon D. Esquiaqui of North Smithfield was arrested and charged with DUI 2nd offense as well as multiple motor vehicle charges.

1235 hours – Sgt. Pitts and Officer Hughes responded to Staghead Drive to locate a subject with a bench warrant from 6th District Court. Henry A. Leite of Burrillville was arrested on the warrant and arraigned later in the day by the bail commissioner.

1438 hours – While on a post on Pascoag Main Street Officer Hughes observed a vehicle being operated by a subject he believed had a suspended license. He initiated a traffic stop on North Main Street and verified that the operator's license was suspended. Megan Belanger was arrested and charged with Driving after Denial, Suspension or Revocation of License. After processing she was released on a summons to appear in District Court and the vehicle was towed from the scene.

Burrillville Public Safety Departments answered 335 calls for service the week of May 13th. In addition, Burrillville Police conducted 34 traffic stops which resulted in 14 Verbal Warnings, 9 no action, 2 Arrests, 7 traffic summons issued and 2 traffic warnings issued.
